# Plant Narratives

Selected plants only.

<b>Botanical Name</b>	<b>Label Narrative</b>
Clematis Sweet Hart	Beautiful white flowers in spring on a small climbing or native Clematis. Attractive deep green parsley-like leaves. Hardy, evergreen. Grows to 1m.
Ficus pumila	A useful medium sized self-clinging climber for covering fences etc with small dark green leaves. Will cling to most surfaces including brick, timber and iron. Remove outward growing woody branches to retain juvenile foliage. Plant in a cool, shady situation in free draining soils. Hardy, evergreen.
Ficus stipulata	A large leaved form of Creeping Fig, known as Ficus stipulata but really is just an adult foliage form of Ficus pumila. Makes a great looking tough climber when grown up tree trunks or walls etc. Grows quickly to 3m or more if allowed. Hardy, evergreen.
Fuchsia procumbens	A dainty sprawling climber or groundcover with small heart-shaped leaves and intriguing little multi-coloured flowers followed by small red fruit in autumn and winter. Prefers shady, moist situations where it forms a lush carpet up to 1.5m wide. Hardy, evergreen.
Hardenbergia vio Alba	Masses of white flowers in winter and early spring on erect strong growing stems. Fast growing, evergreen, and bushy with oval dark-green leaves. Prune to maintain a neat and compact appearance.
Hardenbergia vio Happy Wanderer	A more true purple flowered form of Coral Pea with larger flowers and leaves with a longer flowering season. Fast growing, evergreen, colourful, vigorous.
Hardenbergia vio Rosea	Fast growing, evergreen, bushy form of Hardenbergia with oval, dark-green leaves. Flowering in winter and early spring with marshmallow pink flowers.
Hardenbergia violacea	Bright purple-blue pea shaped flowers. Fast growing.
Hedera canariensis	Canary Island Ivy. Quick growing groundcover or self-clinging climber with large bright green leaves in summer often turning bronze and green in winter. Very tough and versatile, excellent for covering unstable banks. Grows up to 3m. Hardy, evergreen.
Hedera canariensis Variagata	A colourful form of Large Leaved Ivy showing bold cream, white and silver variegations against a background of emerald green. 3m Hardy, evergreen.
Hedera helix	Common Ivy. Provides excellent dense, dark green cover. Hedera helix and its many variations are suitable for indoors or outdoors and make excellent topiary subjects. Plant in sun or shade and in any soil types. Grows up to 2m. Hardy, evergreen.
Hedera helix Glacier	Small broad, divided leaves, silvery grey cream edges. Slower growing with slender trailing stems. 1.5m.
Hydrangea seemanii	A rare self-clinging Hydrangea. Creamy white lacecap flowers.
Jasminum beesianum	A medium sized scrambling or twining climber, with small narrow leaves and fragrant velvety red, small flowers. Prefers full sun and free draining soils. Hardy, evergreen in most areas.
Jasminum azoricum	A controllable scrambling climber, ideal for growing up a post or fence in a warm, sunny aspect. Rich green leaves, highly fragrant flowers through out the year. Full sun or part shade in moist, free draining soil with some initial protection from frosts. Hardy evergreen.
Jasminum Polyanthum	Vigorous twining climber with dark green deeply divided foliage. Masses of carmine red flower buds from June onwards open to white star-shaped, very fragrant, flowers extending through to summer. Prune hard after flowering. Hardy, evergreen.
Lonicera Belgica	Sweetly fragrant flowers. Belgica has reddish-pink and yellow flowers for most of the year and is evergreen or semi-evergreen. Prune after flowering if desired. Scrambling growth to about 4-5m. Sun or part shade in most soils. Hardy, evergreen. (Syn. Americana, Belgica, Splendida)
Lonicera Graham Thomas	Highly fragrant cream trumpet like flowers, turning yellow, from mid summer to early Autumn. Vigorous twinner with foliage blueish beneath. Idea for training on walls, arches, pillars and clambering through old trees. Ht in 10 years 3m x 3m. Plant in sun or part shade in well drained soils.
Mandevilla laxa	An excellent twining climber producing very fragrant, pure white, large trumpet flowers 5cm wide during summer. Plant in a sunny, sheltered situation, in moist, well drained soil. Grows to 3m. Hardy, deciduous.
Pandorea jas. Lady Di	Pure white flowers, grows up to 3m. Half-hardy, evergreen.
Pandorea jas. Rosea	Free flowering form producing a mass of light pink trumpet flowers with red throats. 3m. Hardy, evergreen.
Pandorea pand. Golden Showers	A striking form of Wonga-Wonga Vine with golden orange flowers in profusion in early spring. Smaller growing, finer form suitable for trellis, arching etc. Growing to 2m. Half-hardy, evergreen.
Pandorea pand. Ruby Heart	The earliest flowering variety with masses of creamy coloured flowers marked with a deep ruby throat from late winter to spring. Fairly vigorous grower to 5m. Hardy evergreen.

<b>Botanical Name</b>	<b>Label Narrative</b>
Phaedranthus buccinatorius	A tendril climber growing up to 3m. Impressive blood-red trumpet flowers in late spring, 10cm long. Grows quickly in warm, sunny situations in moist free-draining soil and tolerates light frosts. Half-hardy, evergreen.
Plumbago Royal Cape	Versatile, easy to grow hardy shrub. Deep blue flowers which bloom in large clusters from late Spring to Autumn. Plant in full sun or part shade. Drought tolerant. Grows to 2m high. Prune after flowering.
Solanum jas. Grandiflora	Fast growing climber useful for providing cover and year round flowering in harsh environments. Withstands dry soils, wind, coastal conditions, pollution and frost. Flowers in large clusters, white with yellow centres. Prefers moist, free draining soil in sun or part shade. Prune hard in spring. Grows to 5m. Hardy, evergreen.
Solanum rantonnetii	Deep violet-blue fully rounded flowers, 2.5cm wide and perfumed, in spring to summer on long arching stems. Feed throughout summer to promote flowering and trim as required. Moist, free draining soil and full sun to filtered shade. Grows to 4m. Half-hardy, evergreen or semi-evergreen in more exposed situations.
Stauntonia hexaphylla	Large glossy bright green leaves. Fragrant white flowers tinged violet appear in clusters in spring and summer followed by purple, rounded fruit, up to 10cm long, with juicy, sweet flavoured flesh. Fruits are both edible and ornamental. Vigorous growing climber reaching 5m. Plant in moist, cool, free draining soil. Hardy, evergreen.
Trachelospermum jasminoides	Very attractive and useful climber or groundcover. Fragrant, white star-shaped flowers from spring to autumn. Star Jasmine enjoy a sunny situation with well drained soil. Train onto a trellis or other support or remove the stakes and pin down stems to create a fast growing groundcover. Grows to 2.4 mtrs as a climber or 50 cm high as a groundcover. Plant 60 cm to 1 m apart for group plantings. Hardy, evergreen shrub.
Trachelospermum asiaticum	More slender and compact variety of Trachelospermum, this climber makes dense screen or groundcover. Will cling closely to any surface. Sweetly scented 15mm star-like white flowers with a buff yellow centre. Plant in sun or part shade in any fertile well drained soil. Grows to 3m. Hardy, evergreen.
Trachelospermum jas. Variegata	Near hardy, evergreen climber. Starry white flowers. Fragrant.
